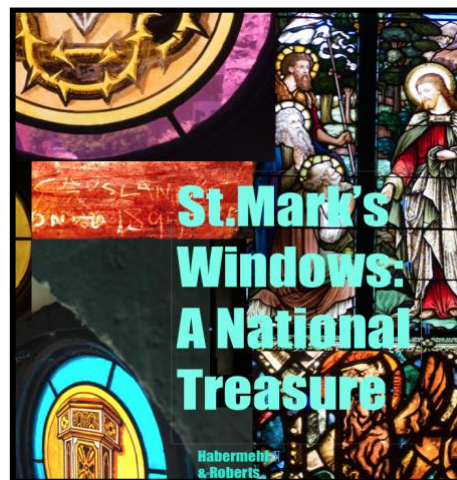

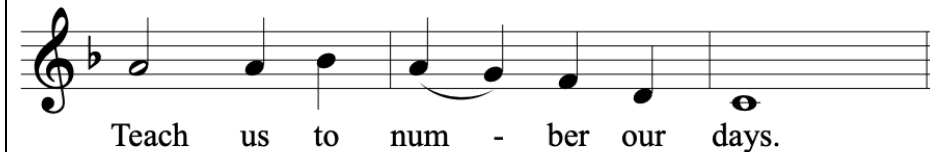
The Proclamation Of The Word
